

OFFICIAL RULES

SCHOLARSHIP OVERVIEW: The Faith Center Academic Faith and Purpose Scholarship Program (“Program”) offered by The Faith Center, Inc. (“Church”), and administered through The Faith Center Academic Faith and Purpose Scholarship Committee (“Committee”), is awarding five (5) scholarships in the respective amounts of \$2,500, \$2,500, \$1,000, \$1,000 and \$500. The Committee will post the Program application to be completed by eligible candidates, including a minimum 900 word personal essay and letters of recommendation. Scholarships do not renew and are paid directly to education providers. The Committee will select five (5) winners based on the candidates meeting all program requirements and the quality of their written essays.

CONTEST DURATION: The Program submission deadline is June 25, 2018, at 5:00 p.m. EDT. No entries will be accepted after the deadline. Candidates should submit their completed application and essay by mail or by hand to The Faith Center Ministries, Attention: TFC Academic Faith & Purpose Scholarship, 5555 NW 95th Avenue, Sunrise, FL 33351 or via email to scholar@thefaithcenterint.org. Winners will be notified by email and phone, and their names will be published on the Church’s website and social media sites. Winners’ names will be announced during the Sunday morning Church service during August 2018. The Committee reserves the right to make changes to Program

PARTICIPANT ELIGIBILITY: The Program is open to high school students who have been active members of the Church for at least one (1) year, graduated high school in May, 2018 (with a minimum 3.5 GPA), and have enrolled in a college or university for 2018 classes. (Church membership is determined by the date the candidate was confirmed or completed a membership class at any Church location. Include activities you have done at the Lauderhill location, where applicable.) Candidates must be individuals and legal residents of the United States. The Program is not offered for educational programs or to candidates who reside outside the United States. The Program is governed by United States law and is subject to all applicable federal, state, and local laws and

ENTRY: Applications for scholarships are limited to one (1) entry per person. Candidates who enter more than one (1) time or for more than one (1) scholarship are automatically disqualified. To be considered to a scholarship award, candidates must complete the Program application, submit letters of recommendations, and write a minimum 900 word personal essay on the designated theme. Essays must be the original work of the candidate. The Committee reserves the right to verify a candidate’s information and the originality of the essay if deemed necessary. Any proof of plagiarism or the infringement upon any rights of any third party in the context of the essay will result in immediate disqualification.

CLAIMING YOUR AWARD: Winners will be notified by email and phone. Failure to provide accurate contact information may result in disqualification. If the Committee is unable to reach a winner within 72 hours, the Committee may in its discretion award the scholarship to another candidate. No guarantee of notification is made to candidates who do not win a Program scholarship.

SCHOLARSHIP AWARD ODDS: A Candidate's chance of winning a scholarship depends on the number of applications submitted and the quality and uniqueness of the personal essay. ALL FEDERAL, STATE AND LOCAL TAXES, AND ANY OTHER COSTS AND EXPENSES, ASSOCIATED WITH THE RECEIPT OR USE OF SCHOLARSHIP AWARD ARE THE SOLE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE WINNER. Scholarships are provided WITHOUT WARRANTY OF ANY KIND, expressed or implied. ALL SCHOLARSHIPS ARE AWARDED SUBJECT TO THE TERMS, RESTRICTIONS, AND LIMITATIONS OF THE PROGRAM. Except as determined by the Committee in its sole discretion, no substitution of the scholarship shall be offered and no transfer of the scholarship to a third party is permitted.

PAYMENT TERMS: Scholarship payments are made directly to education providers. The Committee has the sole discretion and final word over the timing and manner of any scholarship payment. Payments will not be made until the Committee has confirmed that the winning candidate is enrolled in an accredited college or university for 2018 classes. Winners will be required to provide the Committee a letter of acceptance or proof of enrollment from the accredited college or university where the scholarship payment will be made. The Committee may in its sole discretion decline to award payment of the scholarship in the case of a candidate's failure to provide information in a timely manner or if candidate's educational enrollment lapses for any reason.

CONDUCT: By voluntarily participating in the Program, candidates are agreeing to accept and be bound by the official rules of the Program. Candidates agree that all decisions made by the Committee shall be final and binding in all respects. The official rules are accessible throughout the Program period. Failure to comply with the official rules may result in a candidate's immediate disqualification. The Committee reserves the right to disqualify a candidate who is 1) suspected of tampering with the application process or the operation of the Program, 2) acting in any manner deemed by the Committee to be in violation of the official rules, or 3) acting in any manner deemed by the Committee to be unsportsmanlike or disruptive, or with intent to annoy, abuse, threaten or harass any other candidate.

CAUTION: ANY ATTEMPT BY A CANDIDATE OR ANY OTHER INDIVIDUAL TO DELIBERATELY DAMAGE ANY WEBSITE OR UNDERMINE THE LEGITIMATE OPERATION OF THE PROGRAM IS A VIOLATION OF CRIMINAL AND CIVIL LAW AND SHOULD SUCH AN ATTEMPT BE MADE, THE CHURCH RESERVES THE RIGHT TO SEEK DAMAGES AND COSTS (INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION, ATTORNEY FEES) FROM ANY SUCH PERSON TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW.

LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY: The Church assumes no responsibility or liability for (a) any incorrect or inaccurate application information, or for any faulty, failed, garbled or jumbled electronic data transmissions; (b) any unauthorized access to, or theft, destruction or alteration of a Program application at any point in the operation of the Program; (c) any technical malfunction, failure, error, omission, interruption, deletion, defect, delay in operation or communications line failure, regardless of cause, with regard

to any equipment, systems, networks, lines, satellites, servers, computers or providers utilized in any aspect of the operation of the Program; (d) inaccessibility or unavailability of the Internet or any combination thereof, or; (e) any injury or damage to a candidate's or to any other person's computer which may be related to or resulting from any attempt to participate in the Program or download any materials relating to the Program. If, for any reason, the Program is not capable of running as planned for reasons which may include, without limitation, infection by computer virus, bugs, tampering, unauthorized intervention, fraud, technical failures, or any other causes which may corrupt or affect the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Program, then the Church reserves the right at its sole discretion to cancel, terminate, modify or suspend the Program in whole or in part. In the event of cancellation, the Committee will randomly award the scholarships from among all eligible, non-suspect candidates received prior to cancellation.

PRIVACY: Personal information collected through the Program and Committee will be held in confidence and will not be shared with any unauthorized third party. For valuable consideration, each candidate voluntarily consents for the Church to make his or her profile publicly available, to obtain and deliver his or her name, address and other information to third parties for the purpose of administering the Program and complying with applicable laws, regulations and rules, to announce his or her as a winner on the Church's website and social media sites, and to use the candidate's name and image in such announcements without restriction.

PUBLICITY RIGHTS: For valuable consideration, each candidate voluntarily consents to the Church's use of the candidate's name, image and likeness in advertising, promotional and marketing materials throughout the world and by any appropriate means, without compensation, notice, review, or approval. Nothing contained in the official rules obligates the Church to make use of any of the rights granted herein and candidate waives any right to inspect or approve any such use.

GOVERNING LAW/DISPUTES: The Program and its official rules, and any dispute related thereto (whether for breach of contract, tortious conduct or otherwise), are governed by the laws of the state of Florida without regard to conflicts of laws principles. Any legal action, suit, proceeding or dispute in connection with the Program (whether for breach of contract, tortious conduct or otherwise) will be brought and resolved exclusively in the state or federal courts of Broward County in the state of Florida and each candidate accepts and submits to the personal jurisdiction of these courts with respect to any legal actions, suits, proceedings, or disputes arising out of or related to the Program. If any provision(s) of the official rules are held to be invalid or unenforceable, all remaining provisions hereof will remain in full force and effect.

As a condition of participating in the Program, each candidate agrees that any and all disputes that cannot be resolved between the candidate and the Church, Committee or other Program party, and any claim or cause of action arising from or in connection with the Program, the scholarship awarded, or the determination of the winner must be

resolved individually, without resort to any form of class action. Further, in any such dispute, under no circumstance will a candidate be permitted or be entitled to obtain an award for, and hereby waives all rights to claim punitive, incidental, or consequential damages, or any other damages, including attorneys' fees, other than candidate's actual out-of-pocket expenses, if any.

In the event of a dispute concerning the identity of a candidate, the candidate will be declared to be the authorized account holder of the email address provided to the Committee on the application submitted at the time of initial participation (i.e., registration for the Program). An authorized account holder is defined as the natural person who is assigned to an email address by an Internet access provider, online service provider, or other organization (e.g., business, educational institution, etc.) that is responsible for assigning email addresses for the domain associated with the submitted email address. Potential winners may be required to provide the Committee with proof that they are the authorized account holder of the applicable email address. If a dispute cannot be resolved to the satisfaction of the Committee, the application and candidate may be deemed ineligible for participation in the Program at the sole discretion of the Committee.
