2.5 mg oxycodone / 325 mg acetaminophen (for opioid-naïve patients)	Every 6 hrs as needed	Same total maximum as above

*The acetaminophen ceiling (4 g/day) is critical because exceeding it can cause severe liver injury. Some physicians cap the total acetaminophen at 3 g/day to add a safety margin.

Special Populations

Group	Adjustments
Elderly (≥ 65 yr)	Often start at 2.5 mg oxycodone; monitor closely for sedation and constipation.
Renal/Hepatic Impairment	Lower doses; consider alternative opioids with less acetaminophen.
Opioid-Tolerant Patients	May require higher strength (7.5 mg or 10 mg) but must stay within safe acetaminophen limits.

Pregnant/Breastfeeding	Generally avoided; discuss risks/benefits with OB-GYN.
